

TEACHING AND LEARNING

I continue to be very excited about the work being done to enrich our academic experiences for our children. Significant progress is being made academically in both the K-6 and 7-12 grade bands.

Ohio's State Report Card was released earlier this fall. The state report card has recognized six different measures for each school district in Ohio. This important information provides the district with data to develop and plan for instruction for the year. After looking at current data, we measured our performance with last year's performance as well as other local district's performances. The Leetonia School District Exceeded State Standards on the 2022-2023 Ohio School Report Card.

This year's report card contained an overall rating of Four (4) Stars for the 22/23 school year. The report card used a component rating of a star system (1-5 stars) rather than letter grades. Leetonia Schools witnessed significant progress in

Achievement (4 stars), Progress (4 stars) and Gap Closing (5 stars) and Graduation Rate (4 stars). The early literacy component of 3 stars improved from 2 stars in 21/22 for an overall rating of 4 stars! Overall, the district improved in fifteen (15) of the twenty (20) tested areas from the 21/22 school year to the 22/23 school year. Congratulations to our students, staff and school community for an excellent report card.

I attribute much of the success to our entire staff for their endless commitment to continuous improvement. The staff, students and building level leaders have demonstrated increased engagement in academic improvement over the past calendar year.



LEETONIA 7-12 JUNIOR/SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL A MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL FAIRFIELD

The start to the school year has been a huge success. Our students did a great job embracing some of the changes they faced when they returned in August. In addition to a change in leadership at the principal level we welcomed several staff changes. Mrs. Vittori, Mr. Istnick and Ms.

Matejka all stepped into positions that were vacant from last year and have become an integral part of the Bear Family. Mrs. Mary Rice returned as a 9-12 school counselor. Our staff has been busy implementing several initiatives from last school year including utilizing our enrichment period to provide content assistance and social emotional learning opportunities. We were happy to have celebrated some of the positive strides the school has taken when we received our school report card earlier this year.

We continue to offer our students a well rounded education by providing opportunities inside and outside of the class-room. Our students are able to take advantage of clubs and activities including music, robotics, e-sports, athletics and numerous clubs and student organizations. We have added a youth wrestling club to our offerings and it has shown initial success. Our students are also benefiting from a grant based program called ICE (Innovative Career Exploration). We truly have so much to offer our students.

Finally, our school community has had to mourn the loss of one of our own with the recent passing of Mrs. Long. I was impressed with the support our staff, students and community showed in lifting each other up in a time of tragedy. It really showed me what a family the Leetonia school community is. In addition to her role as a teacher Mrs. Long was our robotics coach. That team has chosen to continue to participate in competition to honor Mrs. Long.

I want to personally thank our staff and students for their continued hard work and dedication as we continue through this school year.

The Leetonia K-6 staff worked hard with our Positive Behavior System (PBIS) to decrease negative behavior and increase positive behavior within our classrooms and school. Chromebook Care

Leetonia Schools has made a very significant investment in Technology for students. Every student is provided a Chromebook, case and charger. You can help protect this investment by doing the following:

- 1. Keep your Chromebook charged.
- 2. Transport the Chromebook in the case provided.
- 3. Bring your charger to school every day.
- 4. Keep it clean, don't eat or drink near your Chromebook.
- 5. Don't stack things on the Chromebook.
- 6. When you close the lid, be sure there are no objects on the keyboard.
- 7. Do not remove the inventory sticker from the case or the Chromebook.

If you do have a problem or break your Chromebook, tell your teacher. Then, turn it into the office and fill out a repair form. Most repairs are made the same day.
